- Immediately define syndrome patterns of the majority of reproductive complaints and have the skill to treat each of these syndromes in a comprehensive and truly holistic way
- The advanced knowledge gained through this short learning programme aims to advance CAM practitioners in becoming significant role players in the management and treatment of reproductive health related conditions.

The course will comprise 4 modules, each consisting of 16 hours of lectures, 1 weekend per month for 4 months and an additional 1 weekend of exams.

Module 2: Case taking, Symptom differentiation, Adjuvant diagnostic tools: Tongue and pulse diagnoses, Scan recognition, and Blood test interpretation

Module 3: Syndrome recognition and differentiation, Case progression understanding and management

Module 4: Therapeutic approach as per scope of practice
