Students are also provided with office space and facilities. Additional funding is available for research expenses, travel to conferences, training courses, etc. on a case by case basis. Eligibility:

- South African citizens or permanent residents.
- Will need to be full-time honours students (not in full-time employment), registered in any of the honours programmes offered in the School of Economics at UJ, in 2022.
- The honours research project must be supervised or co-supervised by Prof Fiona Tregenna and/or other members of the SARChI Industrial Development team, and must be linked to the broad field of industrial development.

The South African Research Chairs Initiative (SARChI) is funded by the Department of Science and Innovation and administered by the National Research Foundation. The Chair is hosted at UJ, where it operates as a centre in the College of Business and Economics.
