This presentation considers the possibilities for realising education for sustainable development in Africa. It does this through an analysis and critique of regional policy agendas and in relation to an understanding of the 'postcolonial condition' on the continent. The talk argues that education policy needs to be fundamentally reoriented and harnessed to wider processes of economic, cultural and political transformation in the interests of social and environmental justice.
