Irene Josephine Kearns obtained her BCur (Ed et Admin) and MCur at the University of Johannesburg. Irene holds a position as a lecturer in the Department of Nursing at the University of Johannesburg. She is married to Mervyn, and the proud mother of three daughters and a son and a grandmother of three. Irene shares a passion for nursing, specifically in the field of Midwifery, Nursing Education and Critical Care Nursing.

The critical care practice environment is dependent on nurse educators to transform and empower nursing students with competencies for safe clinical judgement practices. Using the Appreciative Inquiry (AI) method, this study examined how the facilitation of clinical judgement occurs in the critical care education environment of South Africa. Sharing the best approaches to inculcate clinical judgement practice ability and generate clinical judgement practical wisdom could enhance cohesion among all role players of the critical care practice environment, thus optimising their common goal towards safe, critically ill patient outcomes.

The original contribution of this study includes the strategies developed to facilitate safe clinical judgement in the critical care-nursing, education environment of South Africa. One of the evaluators of the strategies was Prof Tanner, the world-renowned author in the field of clinical judgement. The study has been presented at three international nursing education conferences.

Ramatsobane Granny Lekoadi holds a Bachelor's degree in General Nursing, Psychiatric Nursing, Community Nursing and Midwifery from the University of Limpopo. She also obtained a Master's degree in Nursing Science from the University of Limpopo. She is currently employed as a Clinical Programme Coordinator: Professional Development at the central office of the Gauteng Department of Health. She is married with four children, a daughter and three sons. She published in accredited journals.

The purpose of the research study was to develop and describe strategies for psychiatric nurses to facilitate the mental health of family members caring for individuals living with Bipolar Disorder. The study was conducted in three phases. In Phase One, in-depth phenomenological interviews were conducted with purposively sampled family members. Findings revealed that family members experienced taking care of their relatives as exhausting, strenuous and a continuous unmasked responsibility. The family relationships became strained and challenged, and they experienced a need for assistance to cope with caregiving. Based on the findings, a conceptual framework was developed in Phase Two, which guided the development of strategies in Phase Three to facilitate the mental health of family members caring for individuals living with Bipolar Disorder. The original contribution to the body of knowledge of psychiatric nursing is the conceptual framework and strategies to facilitate the mental health of family members caring for individuals living with Bipolar Disorder.

Mthembu, Lindiwe Buyisile (DCur)

Lindiwe Buyisile Mthembu holds a BCur degree in Nursing from the University of South Africa and a Master's degree in Psychiatric Nursing from the University of Zululand. She is currently employed by KwaZulu-Natal College of Nursing as subject head of General Nursing and Psychiatric Nursing Science for the R425 programme that leads to the Diploma in Nursing qualification (General, Psychiatric, and Community and Midwifery). She is married, a mother and a grandmother.

The purpose of this qualitative study was to understand the experiences of grandmothers raising orphaned adolescent grandsons, to develop a model and describe guidelines as a framework of reference for advanced psychiatric nurses to facilitate the mental health of the grandmothers raising their orphaned adolescent grandsons. In-depth phenomenological interviews were conducted with purposively sampled grandmothers. Findings provided insight into the challenges experienced by grandmothers, which included poor communication and interpersonal relationships with adolescent grandsons. Grandmothers believed that their orphaned adolescent grandsons would change for the better. The central concept identified from the findings was "the facilitation of dialogical communication". A model was developed from the central concept, which serves as a tentative structure for the advanced psychiatric nurse to facilitate the grandmothers' dialogical communication with their grandsons as an integral part of the facilitation of their mental health. The unique contribution to the field of mental health is the developed model and guidelines to implement it.

Roets, Marisa (DCur)

Marisa Roets holds a BCur degree in Nursing and an MCur in Psychiatric and Mental Health Nursing, both from the University of Johannesburg. She currently holds the position of Nursing Manager in a private psychiatric hospital. She has published in accredited journals and delivered papers from her thesis at national and international conferences. She is married with two sons.

Psychiatric nurses experience aggression in the workplace among their colleagues. The purpose of this study was to develop, implement and evaluate a model for psychiatric nurses to manage experienced aggression from colleagues in the workplace. The model was developed based on the central concept identified in her previous research, as “the facilitation of self-management” of experienced aggression in the workplace by an advanced psychiatric nurse. Purposively sampled psychiatric nurses participated in a one-day workshop on the facilitation of self-management of aggression. The psychiatric nurses implemented the model for three months in their workplace and then evaluated the model. The psychiatric nurses were of the opinion that they grew personally and professionally. They verbalised that they were able to manage their experiences of aggression in the workplace. The model thus made a unique contribution to psychiatric nursing by providing a framework of reference for psychiatric nurses to self-manage their experienced aggression by colleagues.

Zibi, Portia Sylvia (DCur)

Portia Sylvia Zibi completed her Diploma in General Nursing in 1976, Diploma in Midwifery in 1978, and Diploma in Critical Care in 1981 at Baragwanath Hospital. She acquired her BCur (Education, Administration and Occupational Health Nursing) from the University of South Africa in 1991. Her Master's degree in Nursing Education was completed at the University of Johannesburg in 2004. She completed her doctoral study in November 2018. Two articles have been submitted to accredited journals and she has also presented her work at both national and international conferences.

The purpose of this study was to develop a model to facilitate deep learning in nursing students. A qualitative, exploratory, descriptive, theory generative and contextual research design was followed. Four open-ended questions were asked from concept analysis. Collaborative learning activities included knowledge of students' background; provision of adequate resources; and provision of a democratic learning climate. Interactive learning activities included teachers' characteristics and facilitative skills; and engagement in interactive multidisciplinary didactic activities within the social justice framework. Engagement in multidisciplinary research activities included providing an enabling environment to engage in research on real-life issues; incorporating research skills in the curriculum from the first to fourth year; promoting shared responsibility; and engaging in research programmes locally and internationally. Higher order thinking included the cognitive perspective including critical, reflective, creative and innovative thinking skills. The developed model constitutes the original contribution of this study in nursing education.

Nowak, Irena (DPhil)

Irena Nowak was born and educated in Poland where she obtained a Master's degree in Physical Education. In 1982, she immigrated to South Africa and since then her professional life has been associated with biokinetics and sports science. She has worked at TWR and UJ as a manager of the Biokinetic and Sports Science Clinic for the past 28 years.

The main aim of the thesis was to examine the effectiveness of multi-modal exercise therapy in the management of patients with Parkinson's disease. This was the first interdisciplinary study in the South African context, which encompassed the motoric and psychological symptoms of Parkinson's patients and their caregivers. The study further examined the value of exercise in respect of the quality of life of patients and their caregivers.

The results indicated that land-based and aquatic exercises were equally effective in improvement of the motor function of the Parkinson's patients, such as postural stability, rigidity and strength, as well as depression in comparison to the control participants.

The outcome of the study supported the importance of exercise induced neuro-regeneration of the brain, which may lead to slowing down of the progression of Parkinson's disease. In addition, this thesis provided biokinetic practitioners with a testing protocol, which allows for effective assessment and in-depth analysis of the motor functions of Parkinson's patients.
