**Mvula, Bernard Dandenault (DTech)**

Bernard Mvula was born in Mzimba District, Northern Region of Malawi in 1968. He went to St. Patrick's Seminary from where he matriculated in 1987. He completed his Diploma in Biomedical Sciences (1996) in Malawi and graduated with a BTech: Biomedical Technology degree from UJ in 2006. Following this qualification, he joined the Laser Research Centre for both his masters' and doctoral studies. He is currently employed by the Ministry of Health in Malawi, working at a Public Health Institute. Bernard has published a number of articles in accredited international journals and his work has also been presented at conferences.

Bernard Mvula's doctoral study entails the isolation and characterization of Adipose Derived Stem Cells (ADSCs) isolated from adipose tissue and co-cultured with Smooth Muscle Cells (SMCs). Smooth Muscle Cells constitute most parts of the intestinal, urinary, reproductive and cardiovascular systems and hold dire consequences for patients in the event of disease. Low Intensity Laser Irradiation (LILI) has been found to induce biostimulatory effects on different cell types including ADSCs. Stem cells have the potential to differentiate into several different lineages when stimulated by the addition of growth factors. The aim of the study was to investigate the differentiation potential of ADSCs when co-cultured with SMCs and the potential biostimulatory role of LILI. His research findings suggests that ADSCs have the ability to differentiate into SMCs when co-cultured with SMCs even in the absence of growth factors while LILI potentially augments the differentiation potential, proliferation and viability. The significant role that LILI has to offer in the use of ADSC therapy for regenerative medicine was highlighted in this study.

**Sukha, Anusha Yasvantai (DPhil)**

Anusha Yasvantai Sukha matriculated at Nirvana Secondary School in Lenasia, Johannesburg. In 1999 she received her Bachelor's degree in Optometry from the then RAU. During 2000 Anusha started her private optometry practice and from 2002-2009 she supervised final year optometry students on a part-time basis. She received her MPhil from the University of Johannesburg (2008) and in 2009 the Certificate of Advanced Study (in Contact Lenses, Ocular Physiology and Anterior Segment Disease) from the New England College of Optometry. Anusha has published five papers in accredited journals and is currently completing two further papers based on her doctoral thesis.

The visual system has exquisite sensitivity to objects of different contrast and many physiological or pathological processes influence our ability to appropriately identify variable levels of foreground and background contrast. Understanding contrast in a kinetic environment is a critical element in human survival and development. Precise measurement of contrast visual acuity is thus an essential part of optimizing clinical and experimental assessment of vision function and this research mainly explores the statistical reliability of a computerized method for measuring visual acuity at high, medium and low contrast levels. Both univariate and multivariate methods were applied to develop knowledge of reliability and short-term variation of repeated measures of contrast visual acuity, both within and across human eyes in relation to factors such as gender and age. The multivariate and quantitative analysis of contrast acuity as applied and developed by this candidate is unique and constitutes an important clinical and experimental method that may enhance earlier identification of eyes at risk, that is, from damage and dysfunction due to many conditions such as diabetes or age-related degenerations of the eye. The research of this candidate may lead to improvements in understanding and treatment of disease with undesirable ocular effects.

## **Morgan, Brandon (DLitt et Phil)**

Brandon Morgan gained his master's degree in Psychology from the University of Johannesburg in 2008. Since then he has held several research positions at the University of Johannesburg, the University of the Witwatersrand, and JvR Psychometrics. He has authored or co-authored nine articles published in international and national journals, contributed eight chapters to academic books, and presented six papers at international and national conferences. He serves on the Psychometrics Committee of the Health Professions Council of South Africa. In 2014 he was awarded the International Test Commission (ITC) Scholarship for promising young academics globally.

The purpose of the study was to construct a reliable and valid vocational interest inventory based on John Holland's circular model of vocational personality types for the South African population. A related goal was to examine the veracity of the circular model of vocational personality types, which was developed in Northern America, in the African context. The South African Career Interest Inventory represents the six primary vocational personality types identified by Holland: Realistic, Investigative, Artistic, Social, Enterprising and Conventional. Whereas previous research called into question the utility of these types in non-Western contexts, the candidate demonstrated that Holland's model indeed replicates well in the African context, on condition that appropriate local content rather than imported content is used. The results showed that the South African Interest Inventory can confidently be used to assess vocational interests across gender, different language groups, and ethnicities. These findings hold the important theoretical implication that predictions and interpretations based on Holland's model, which has proven extraordinarily useful in Western contexts, hold in the South African context, which in turn attests to the universality of basic vocational personality structure. From a methodological perspective the study demonstrates how universal meaning and measurement invariance in psychological assessment can be achieved by incorporating local conditions and particular content. The study holds the practical implication that career counsellors can confidently use the South African Career Interest Inventory to guide young and working adults in making responsible career decisions.

**Mwipikeni, Peter (DLitt et Phil)**

Peter Mwipikeni gained his master's degree in Philosophy from the University of Zimbabwe in November 2007. The title of his dissertation was "The moral implications of stakeholder ethics in business." He has presented guest lectures at St John Vianney Seminary in Pretoria, St Augustine College in Johannesburg, the University of Zimbabwe in Harare, and at Arrupe College, Jesuit School of Philosophy and Humanities in Harare. In 2013 he was awarded a prize as the best tutor in the Department of Philosophy at UJ. He has presented papers at an international workshop and the national conference of the Philosophical Society of Southern Africa.

The candidate investigates the work of Jürgen Habermas on decision-making about laws and policies in democratic societies. Habermas is arguably the most influential political philosopher in Europe in recent times. Habermas proposes dialogue between different interest groups where better reasoning determines decision-making in a fair way by taking into account everyone's interests. However, Habermas's model of dialogue as communicative action breaks down in tough cases where groups with widely diverging interests negotiate political solutions to urgent problems. In such cases Habermas recommends bargaining as a decision-making process. Through bargaining strong elite groups can dominate instead of seeking satisfactory resolutions to difficult disputes. The candidate argues that bargaining can disregard the important interests of vulnerable groups in unfair ways. The candidate then examines the work of John Rawls, the greatest political philosopher of the 20<sup>th</sup> century, for a possible remedy to this flaw in bargaining. He shows how Rawls's theory of objective political judgement can avoid bargaining. The candidate's novel interpretation and application of Rawls's work enable humans to make decisions about intense, complex political conflicts that demonstrate proper respect for fellow citizens. Citizens can always hope to reach fair decisions that take into account every citizen's basic needs in fitting ways.

**Mzondi, Abraham Modisa Mkhondo (DLitt et Phil)**

Modisa Mzondi co-founded, with two other leaders, a church called Let My People Go Ministries in 1987. He completed his theological studies at the Global School of Theology (Global University, South African chapter). He completed his BA (Bible and Theology) in 2001 and his MA (Ministerial Studies Leadership) in 2005. He gained his first doctorate (DLitt et Phil in Theology) at the University of Johannesburg in 2009. In addition to pastoral work in the church that he co-founded, he has been involved in youth work, family issues, leadership and management, theological teaching and various community work programmes.

Mzondi's focus on god and *Ubuntu* constructs affirms the fact that people are natural social constructivists involved in a continuous process of conceptualising ideas that give meaning to their contexts. His innovative juxtaposing of these two constructs extends what is known of new god ideas to that of *Ubuntu* or African "humanness". Whereas social-constructionism served as the broad overarching hermeneutical tool for this study, feminism was used as the specific interpretative framework to critically scrutinise mostly patriarchally biased conceptualisations of god and *Ubuntu*. In contrast to Western feminism, African womanism, with its emphasis on African Motherhood/Womanhood, contributed to a much-needed contextually and culturally sensitive analysis of *Ubuntu* in particular. The final conclusion of the study was that there are various god and *Ubuntu* constructs and that it is no longer tenable to claim a single (dogmatic/essentialist) god or a single (dogmatic) *Ubuntu* to structure reality meaningfully. "Truth" lives only momentarily as history continues to unfold and people find new ways in their search for meaning.

**Stathopoulos, Georgios (DLitt et Phil)**

Georgios Stathopoulos was born in Kallithea Agriniou (Greece) in 1959. He gained his Teaching Diploma at the Academy of Rhodos in 1980, his Degree in Education at the University of Ioannina in 2004, his Higher Degree of Education at Ioannina in 2007, and his MA in History on the topic of people's civilisation in modern and contemporary Greek society at Ioannina University. He has published on Greek folklore and Greek collective memory. Since 1982 he has been teaching at a state school at Agrinion. Georgios Stathopoulos is married and has three children.

In his doctoral thesis, entitled "The Neohellenic Statues in Missolonghi (1829-2011) as Reference Fields for the Collective and Historical Memory as well as the National Identity of the Greek People", Georgios Stathopoulos has made an essential contribution to the fields of local history and memory studies in Greece, while covering one of the main 'conductors' of memory, namely the public statues. Missolonghi became known as the 'holy city' of modern Greece, because of its role during the Greek revolution against the Ottoman Turks in the 1820s. Georgios Stathopoulos has not only presented the abundant monuments themselves as a comprehensive 'corpus', but he has also covered the crucial dimensions of his subject with scholarly authority. All external assessors as well as the supervisors agree on the great value of his findings and the fact that he has very successfully analysed this very up-to-date subject in the well-documented framework of the sources of neo-Greek history. They all agree that the thesis should be published in the future.
