Dear Prospective UJ Student

Well done on your successful completion of the 2022 academic year. Please take note of the following important information and dates for the 2023 academic year.

1. COVID-19 RELATED INFORMATION

UJ has a vaccination policy in place, which can be found on the UJ website. The UJ Council approved the relaxing of some of the Mandatory Vaccination Policy stipulations and Implementation Protocols. Should there be an adverse effect in the risk to our staff, students, and third parties, the University may be required to reinstate the suspended measures.

2. FINAL ADMISSION

PLEASE NOTE: Receiving this registration information letter <u>does not</u> imply in any way that you have been admitted or will be admitted for the 2023 academic year.

- 2.1 UJ will receive all final Grade 12 results from the Department of Basic Education. It is not necessary to email or submit a hard copy of your results to the University unless requested to do so.
- 2.2 Once selections have been finalised, the Student Enrolment Centre will inform you of your admission status by SMS and/or email.
- 2.3 No notice regarding your application status is official and binding on the University unless it has been sent by email to you from the University's official email server.
- 2.4 Should you not have received an email regarding your application status by 20 January 2023 you can verify your application status online by clicking <u>here</u> or contact our Call Centre on 011 559 4555.

3. <u>REGISTRATION DETAILS</u>

Registration commences on 20 January 2023 and closes on 10 February 2023 (only online, off-campus registrations will be allowed).

Register as early as possible due to programmes being filled during the first few days of registration. Spaces cannot be guaranteed.

- 3.1 Note that the registration dates may be adjusted. Any such changes will be published on the UJ website.
- 3.2 No on-campus facilities will be available for registration. All registrations are done online and off-campus, for which you may use a tablet/handheld device or any other computer facility at your disposal.
- 3.3 Follow this link <u>https://www.uj.ac.za/admission-aid/registration/</u> to access registration information and follow the step-by-step guide.
- 3.4 Review your **Proof of Registration** to ensure that your qualification and all the module registration(s) are complete and correct for the entire year.
- 3.4 Do note that any **previous studies (at a higher education institution) MUST be declared to UJ**. The nondeclaration of previous studies serves as sufficient reason for the cancellation of your registration (please refer to the Returning student registration information letter published on the registration website) https://www.uj.ac.za/admission-aid/registration/

Only <u>REGISTERED STUDENTS</u> may participate in academic activities.

4. PAYMENTS

All students, including students whose fees are paid by sponsors or employers, **are required to pay the following minimum amounts in order to register**:

- 4.1 Day students (tuition fees) All students not residing in the residences R3 870.00
- 4.2 Residence students (tuition fees and residence deposit)
 - 4.2.1 Only students with acceptance letters from residences **R6 470.00**
 - 4.2.2 Residence students (provisionally selected/waiting for a space in residence): R3 870.00

Payment methods:

- 4.3 Credit cards (E-payments) will reflect on your UJ student account immediately. Alternative payment methods used will not reflect immediately and may impact on securing a place.
- 4.4 For online E-payments please use the following link: https://ulink.uj.ac.za.
- 4.5 <u>Please note that you must cancel your registration at the University if you decide to discontinue or</u> withdraw from your gualification or study programme or register at another institution.

4.6 <u>The following cancellation rules will apply:</u>

4.6.1 Total cancellation of studies

- 4.6.1.1 Cancellation on or before 25 February 2023: In this case, a total refund of the paid tuition fees and/or residence fees (where applicable) may be processed, except for the registration fee (R610,00) and ICT levy (R430,00) which are non-refundable.
- 4.6.1.2 Cancellation after 25 February 2023 (see point 4.6.2 below).

Cancellation on or before 25 February 2023: No fees payable (except for the registration fee (R610,00) and ICT levy (R430,00) which are non-refundable).

Cancellation on or before 08 April 2023: 75% credit is granted (except for the registration fee (R610,00) and ICT levy (R430,00) which are non-refundable).

Cancellation on or before 29 July 2023: 50% credit is granted (except for the registration fee (R610,00) and ICT levy (R430,00) which are non-refundable).

Cancellation after 29 July 2023: No credit is granted.

5. CHANGES TO REGISTRATION

- 5.1 Requests for cancellation or change of studies should be submitted to the relevant faculty officer in the faculty where you are registered. Faculty officer details as well as the submission form can be obtained at https://www.uj.ac.za/admission-aid/registration/. Failure to do so will result in students being liable for the fees for the relevant year.
- 5.2 Additions of modules can only be done during the registration period. No further additions of modules will be permitted.
- 5.3 Telephonic cancellations will not be accepted.
- 5.4 Students who fail to notify the University officially before the prescribed dates will forfeit any claim to the reimbursement.

All undergraduate students will be expected to complete ONE of the following Short Learning Programmes: (1) 'African Insights' an introduction to the intellectual traditions and debates in Africa, or (2) 'Artificial Intelligence in the 4IR'. The programmes are online and are available on https://ulink.uj.ac.za/. On successful completion, you will receive an electronic certificate, and this achievement will reflect on your academic record. Both programmes are stimulating and relevant. You are encouraged to complete both programmes, although completion of only one is compulsory. You may choose which one to complete.

12. TIMETABLES

Personalised lecturing timetables are also accessible via uLink after registration. Personalised exam timetables for the main exams in Jun and Nov, will be accessible via uLink some 4 weeks before the start of the relevant exam.

13. MERIT BURSARIES

14. TRANSFER STUDENTS

Spaces for transferring students are limited. An official academic record is required together with the syllabus outline for the module for which credit is requested. Credit transfer requests must be approved by the relevant department where the qualification is registered. Please contact the College/Faculty Office for assistance.

15. INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

Students who are abroad and will still be in their home countries awaiting immigration documents during the registration period may be allowed to register conditionally under the conditions explicated in point (see point 16).

- 15.1 International students who are in South Africa at the time of registration are not eligible for conditional registration.
- 15.2 The Faculty of Science as well as the Faculty of Engineering and the Built Environment do not allow conditional registrations.
- 15.3 The Division for Internationalisation will be assisting with off-campus clearance from Monday, 9 January 2023 and would like to encourage students to make use of the off-campus clearance and registration process. Temporary Residence Visa holders (i.e., Study, Work, Critical Skills Visa, and Relative with an endorsement to study at the University of Johannesburg or Diplomatic Permit), Special Dispensation (i.e., ZEP) need to submit proof of valid medical aid cover, registered, and administered in South Africa according to the Medical Schemes Act.
- 15.4 First-time registering students with a Temporary Resident Visa (i.e., Study, Work), with an endorsement to study at the University of Johannesburg or Diplomatic Permit need to submit certified copies of passport and/or a valid visa.
- 15.5 Permanent Residence Permit holders, Asylum Seekers, and Refugees with valid permits are required to submit a certified copy of the permit.

16 CONDITIONAL REGISTRATION FOR ACADEMIC PURPOSES

Requests for conditional registration are approved by the relevant College/Faculty.

Conditions:

- 16.1 Registration must take place during the formal registration period.
- 16.2 Payment must be received for the applicable registration amount, which includes the non-refundable registration fee and ICT levy.
- 16.3 The conditional registration agreement must be signed (in addition to the standard registration agreement). The document is available on the registration page of the UJ website.
- 16.4 Submission of all required documents.
- 16.5 Where required, the attendance of in-person classes from **15 March 2023**.

Conditional registration will expire, and registration will be cancelled by 10 March 2023, or an earlier date as determined by the Faculty/College. The standard cancellation rules in respect of fees will apply. Conditionally

registered students are not eligible for placement in UJ residences. Upon full registration, students may be considered for placement in UJ residence, should there be space available.

17 AGREEMENT BETWEEN UNDERAGED STUDENTS (YOUNGER THAN 18 YEARS) AND THE UNIVERSITY

All underaged applicants are required to enter into an agreement with the University before registration can take place.

If you are under the age of 18 on the day you register, you and your parent/guardian must accept the online agreement. Alternatively, the form will be available from <u>www.uj.ac.za/registrations</u> and the completed form is to be submitted to the Student Enrolment Centre to unblock you for registration.

Learning with Technology – information letter to all First Year Students 2023

(Centre for Academic Technologies - CAT)



Welcome to the University of Johannesburg. We are here to help and guide you to connect to UJ's online resources.

Click on the CAT image to watch a Welcome to CAT @ UJ video.

All the information from the video is in this letter, and we have provided links to assist you in going online easily.

Firstly, uLink is the portal to all online facilities at UJ. Here you will find all the relevant tools to help you carry out your daily tasks as a student and successfully complete your studies. You will need to use a <u>password</u> (that you create when you register) to log into uLink. Once you log into <u>uLink</u>, you will find your Blackboard (Bb) learning modules, personal timetable and registration information, results for tests and examinations, financial statements, the inter-campus bus schedule, and many more. You can also find links to free software such as Microsoft Office and UJ services such as the library. Do take a minute to explore the different tabs or quick links available on uLink. If you use your phone for online learning, we suggest you download the Blackboard Learn app for your mobile phone or tablet.

A lot of your learning will take place online, so you need to familiarise yourself with Blackboard, UJ's Learning Management System. On Blackboard, you will find a menu with all the modules (subjects) that you are registered for. (On Bb, they are called courses.) In each module, you will receive announcements for that specific module, find module information and content, be able to communicate with your lecturer, tutors and other students inside the module. You can also view videos and download learning material. All your academic work will be done in this online space.

To help you get used to Blackboard, we have created a module where you can practice how to submit an assignment, take a test or assessment, and participate in a discussion. You can find the module by logging into uLink: click on the Blackboard tab and go to Courses. Scroll down in the right-hand banner to find TC02022 First Year Orientation: Learning with Technology (uLink \rightarrow Blackboard Login \rightarrow Courses \rightarrow TC02023 First Year Orientation: Learning with Technology).

You can work through the module on your own. You are encouraged to join any live, <u>guided Blackboard session</u> that will take place over a period of eight weekdays from 25 January to 3 February 2023. Please note that the links will only be live during the set time of the sessions. Three sessions are scheduled per day. You may join any session that suits you and are welcome to join as many of these sessions as you feel you need to, in order to be well-prepared for classes which will start on Monday, 13 February 2023. Please also make sure to visit your faculty's orientation module (uLink \rightarrow Blackboard Login \rightarrow Organisations \rightarrow First Year Orientation), where you will find important information and tips to help you to settle in and be successful in your studies.

Please do not purchase textbooks unless recommended by your lecturers. Students will either be able to buy an entry level computer at UJ or be eligible for a loan laptop.
