




# What is the Visualise Your Thesis (VYT) Competition?



# Who is eligible to apply?

Currently-enrolled graduate researchers (i.e. students enrolled in M.Phil., Masters by Research, Ph.D. or Professional Doctorate programmes) at any stage of their candidature who are active and attending of registered VYT institutions.

## Not eligible to enter VYT are;

- Honours students
- Masters by coursework students (even if their program has a research/thesis component)
- Graduate researchers on a leave of absence (= inactive and not attending)
- Lapsed candidates
- Graduate researchers who are employed by their university who may have, or may be perceived to have, influence over the outcome, research funding or related resourcing, or an otherwise unfair advantage over the other entrants from their university.





# Technical requirements – General

Download the Visualise Your Thesis Presentation template to your computer, delete the text, images and video in the template and add your own content. You may add additional slides to the template, however:

- Your presentation (excluding the pre-formatted bookend slides, i.e. title and reference slides) will be displayed for a **maximum of 60 seconds.** Most VYT videos end up being around 70-75 seconds.
- The bookend slides are set to display for 5 seconds you can add additional reference slides if required
- Ensure your slides are set to advance automatically
- Of important note: Include your **ORCiD** on the title page and any other platforms (**LinkedIn**, **Twitter** or **Instagram handle**) which are used for dissemination of your research.
- To create an ORCiD profile, visit: <u>https://orcid.org/</u>
- Your entry must be compatible with PowerPoint 2016 for Windows. Please test your entry before submitting it.







# Technical requirements – PowerPoint and Audio

### Be creative and change the layout, text boxes, colours and fonts, just make sure you:

- Do not change the layout, design, or colours of the bookend slides, being the title slide and the references slide (i.e. the first and last slides)
- Do not use a body text font size smaller than **14 pt**
- Do not change the **Page Setup** in PowerPoint (your entry will be displayed on a screen in **widescreen** format)

### Make sure your audio and video:

- 1. Is **embedded** in the PowerPoint file. Do not submit separate media files. For example, you cannot embed a link to an online video from YouTube or Vimeo. The file must be saved within your PowerPoint.
- 2. Starts automatically and plays for the duration of the slide or entry.
- 3. Is optimised and compressed.

Audio can include music, sound effects, or voiceovers.

- Documentation of First Nations peoples' heritage in all forms of media
- If this is applicable to research being presented with VYT, graduate researchers and institutions should refer to what is culturally appropriate as stated by cultural groups and organisations based in their geographical location.

### Generative Artificial Intelligence (GAI) and Software's

- Reference and GAI and software tool used.
- If a student has purchased a tool, please ensure that you send us your proof of purchase. E.g Adobe creative cloud and PowerPoint.

### Language

VYT accepts videos in any language, however please provide the subtitles and transcript in English.

## **Copyright Requirements**

Correct referencing of material and copyright compliance is required. Types of material to be considered:


- Knowledge / Intellectual property
