



Advanced Diploma in Communication Management **Qualification code: A7001Q**

Frequently Asked Questions

This document aims at answering questions you may have about enrolling for the Advanced Diploma in Communication Management in the Department of Strategic Communication. For more information, please also visit the Postgraduate website [here](#)

The qualification will be offered for the first time in 2021 on our Bunting Road campus.

What is an Advanced Diploma in Communication Management?

The Advanced Diploma in Communication Management is a one-year qualification. It provides students who completed a diploma or degree in public relations, communication management and other communication related qualifications with an opportunity to acquire professional knowledge and skills for a career in public relations and communication management.

This qualification allows for access to the Bachelor of Arts Honours majoring in Strategic Communication (NQF level 8) offered within the Department of Strategic Communication.

The purpose of this qualification is for a student to develop the competence to strategically analyse, plan, apply and evaluate Communication Management in diverse contexts. Students will be prepared to develop innovative, professional and globally recognised solutions to address strategic communication (focussing predominantly on Communication Management and Public Relations) challenges relevant to the South African contexts as well as addressing global communication management developments.

Compulsory modules include the following four:

- Issues in Strategic Communication Management
- Stakeholder Management
- Communication Leadership and Change
- Digital Contexts

Do I need to attend class?

Blended learning, comprising a combination of online and compulsory in-class lectures, is the mode of delivery. These classes take place on Tuesday and Thursday evenings, from 5pm to 8pm. You will receive your time table after registration.

Make sure that you get the necessary written consent from your line manager at your workplace before you enrol. You will probably need to leave the office a little earlier to be in time for class.

To assess outcomes, a combination of assessments take place. These include tests, assignments, case studies, and/or projects and exams.

What do I need to qualify to apply for the Advanced Diploma in Communication Management?

1. You need to have a relevant Communication qualification from a SAQA accredited institution with an exit level six (NQF level 6). It is your responsibility to provide us with proof of accreditation if requested by the selection committee.

Examples of NQF level 6 qualifications offered at UJ included the Diploma in Communication Management and Public Relations, and the BA Degree majoring in Strategic Communication. Completion of these and other in the same or a relevant field of study or discipline in strategic communication are suitable when applying for the Advanced Diploma.

2. Academic standards required:

- In addition to the minimum admission requirements, prospective students must obtain a minimum of 60% average in their final year in a relevant Diploma or BA degree in order to be admitted to the Advanced Diploma.
- The discretion of the selection committee may be applied in special cases.

3. The University reserves the right not to admit applicants to a particular Advanced Diploma in Communication Management programme in accordance with programme-specific selection criteria and other relevant criteria such as:
 - the limitations of enrolments per programme;
 - capping of admissions in terms of the University's approved enrolment plan or professional regulatory requirements;
4. You need to provide the following as part of your application:
 - Official academic record from the university where you studied (printouts from the Internet will not be accepted).
 - If you are still studying and you are busy completing the final year of your diploma or degree, you may be provisionally accepted, based on your marks up to the midyear exam of the year of your application.
 - A certified copy of your ID document.
5. Applications close on **31 October 2020 at noon**. No late applications will be accepted. Please note that you need to apply online on the website <http://www.uj.ac.za> or complete a hard copy of the application and submit it at the UJ Enrolment Centre. **Please note:** only online applications via the website will be accepted. No email applications are accepted.
6. Applicants must be available for an interview if required by the selection committee.
7. **International Students:** Please note we require that you **submit an evaluation from the South African Qualification Authority (SAQA) of your degree to consider your application**. Your application cannot be finalised without a SAQA certificate.

Can I apply for the Advanced Diploma in Communication Management at UJ if I completed a Diploma or Degree at another university?

Yes, if you meet the entrance criteria as stated above. You will need to provide a full academic record issued by the university you attended, showing that you have a strong theoretical grounding in the relevant field/s of Public Relations, Corporate Communication, Marketing Communication, and/or Strategic Communication and related disciplines.

What do I need to pass the module?

You need a minimum of 50% year mark after completion of the examination for each module to pass a module. In addition, all class tests, individual assignments and group assignments are compulsory.

How do I apply and when do applications close for an Advanced Diploma in Communication Management?

Do you have a mid-year intake for the Advanced Diploma in Communication Management? Can I register in June to apply for an Honours?

No, there is only one intake per year, in January.

Is the qualification recognised by SAQA?

Yes. NQF Level 07. SAQA Qualification ID: 108857. Credits: 120

What is a relevant qualification?

You need to have a relevant Communication qualification from a SAQA accredited institution, as an NQF level six (6). It is your responsibility to provide the Department with proof of accreditation, if requested by the selection committee.

If I do not have a diploma or degree in public relations, strategic communication, marketing communication, corporate communication, can I still qualify for an Advanced Diploma in Communication Management?

A potential student should have obtained a Diploma in Public Relations on an NQF level 6 or a BA degree on NQF level 7 from the University of Johannesburg. Candidates from other tertiary institutions should have obtained a Diploma in Public Relations or related fields (NQF level 6) or a BA degree on a NQF level 7 or the equivalent thereof and could apply for admission to the Departmental Academic Board that will evaluate each application individually.

Your undergraduate qualifications need to clearly show that you have a strong theoretical grounding in the field/s of Public Relations, Corporate Communication, Marketing Communication and/or Strategic Communication or related communication fields. Without this you will not qualify for the Advanced Diploma.

Will my work experience be taken into consideration?

These cases are dealt with on an individual ad-hoc basis and may be taken into account in the event where an individual has more than five years' experience in a relevant industry. However, all other requirements and criteria still need to be met.

Does achieving the minimum admission criteria guarantees a place in the programme?

No, achieving 60% weighted average in the relevant subjects is the minimum requirement for your application to be considered but does not guarantee admission. The Advanced Diploma programme is very competitive and there is a limited number of places each year; preference is given to the highest achieving candidates.

What can I do to improve my academic average in order to qualify?

In the event where an applicant does not meet the 60% average requirement, a qualification registered as NQF level 6 qualification on the National Qualifications Framework (NQF) could be completed and the individual can then re-apply to complete the Advanced Diploma.

If I receive a letter of acceptance, will a place be reserved for me to register until the end of the registration period?

If you are accepted to the programme you need to register as soon as possible, once the UJ registration period begins. The university follows "first come, first serve" registration policy, which means that if the places in the programme are filled up before the end of the registration period, the registration for the programme is closed.

Therefore, once your application has been approved and you have been finally accepted, you are urged to register at your earliest convenience, pay the registration fee, and send us proof of registration to secure your place.

Once capacity has been reached and we are full, registration will be closed for our Honours qualification. Should you still want to study with us, we advise you to apply again the following year.
