NOTES

Academic Calendar

- Each academic year runs from February to November.
- Each year is split into two semesters with the winter holidays dividing them:
 - The first semester runs from February until June.
 - The second semester runs from July until November.

Courses

- Typically one semester course is equal to one course credit.
- Each degree programme consists of a certain number of semester courses or modules that you must complete in order to receive the degree. The BA (Psychology) programme requires that you complete 22 courses.
- Courses are named according to the year level and whether they run in the first or the second semester. Courses with the letters A,C, E, G run during the first semester and courses with letters B, D, F, H run in the second semester, for example, Psychology 1A, is a first year level course (1) and is presented in the first semester (A).
- For each year level you must complete a specified number of first and second semester courses, for example, you must complete four first semester and four second semester courses in your first year for the BA (Psychology) degree programme.
- A major subject or course is one that you will take every year of the degree programme, for example, for BA (Psychology), you will take Psychology on first, second, and third year level. There are two major subjects in the BA (Psychology) degree programme. You can choose your second major subject.
- An elective course is an extra course which you are required to complete as part of the programme. In some cases, you are required to take an elective up to a certain year level, for example, in the BA (Psychology) degree programme, you must take an elective course in your first year and then continue with that course in your second year.
