International collaboration during my PhD

During my research I attended work sessions as part of my research process, to stay informed and up to date with latest trends regarding my research subject. I handed in an abstract to the World Association for Cooperative Education (WACE) 8th International Symposium in Graz, Austria in 2010. My abstract was accepted and I participated in an Academic Salon named: Engaging Faculty & Enhancing Outcomes towards Academic and Professional Progress of Students. This sharing confirmed my interpretation, that there is a need to research information management pertaining to the three parties namely Higher Education Institutions, Student and Industry involved in work-integrated learning. The Academic Salon is a round table discussion between different WACE members from universities across the world. After my round table discussion at the WACE 8th International Symposium in Graz, Austria I communicated to the members of WACE who participated in the session requesting advice. The rationale with this initiative was to communicate with specialists in the field in order to enrich my research study. Based on communication, invitations were received from Professor Oloroso and Professor Cates to do my research at their universities. My collaboration was with Professor Helen Oloroso from the Northwestern University of Engineering in Illinois and Professor Cheryl Cates and Professor Kettil Cedercreutz from the University of Cincinnati. As part of my PhD research and data collection I visited the two mentioned universities for a period of two weeks each, where I did semi-structured individual interviews with professors, industry partners as well as with some students at the Northwestern University of Engineering in Chicago, Illinois and University of Cincinnati in March 2012.

As part of my research I found a critical theory on information management protocols and communicated with the author of the Theory of Motived information management model. The author of this theory, was identified as Professor Walid Afifi and his spouse, both professors at the University of Iowa in the USA. In my communications with Professor Afifi I received significant guidance and learning in this interaction, adding value to research on this subject matter. This collaboration have created the opportunity to continue the relationship and enhance learning experience as guided by specialists in their field of expertise. Maintaining this relationship will facilitate learning on latest research and allow for exposure to latest trends and thinking on information management theories by academia in the field. I presented the findings of my PhD in June 2014 to Northwestern University of Engineering in Chicago, the University of Cincinnati and the University of Iowa.
