## REGISTRATION

Once you receive the admission letter, you will be eligible to register.

Academic merit bursaries made available by industry partners are managed by the STH and are awarded annually on the grounds of exceptional academic achievement. Your final senior certificate will determine your first-year bursary.

## **NSFAS**

UJ offers a loan option for financially needy and academically deserving students through the National Student Financial Aid Scheme (NSFAS). This is for full-time undergraduate students with South African citizenship.

### INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

The success of an international application depends on both the confirmation of academic acceptance and the obtaining of the necessary statutory documentation and state approval. The following documenttation is required:

### Certified copies of:

- a) Passport;
- b) Study permit;
- c) USA evaluation of the school-leaving certificate;
- d) English proficiency test certificate or proof of English passed
- at school- leaving level; and
- e) Proof of SA medical insurance cover.

All prospective international students are required to submit proof of English language proficiency, which may consist of:

- a) the results of the internationally recognised International English Language Testing System (IELTS) test (with a score determined by the relevant faculty/college)
- b) English passed at school-leaving level (at a level determined by the relevant faculty/college);
- c) the results of the UJ English Language Programme (UJELP) test (at a level determined by the relevant faculty/college).
