

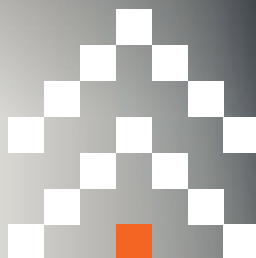

Continuing Education Programmes at the University of Johannesburg Faculty of Law

The University of Johannesburg offers a varied list of Continuing Education Programmes (CEPs), formerly termed the extracurricular programmes, which cater for the needs of both aspiring and established careerists in the formal employment sector. 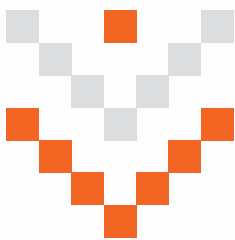
