Purpose of the Qualification

The LL.M. in Labour Law (one year full-time or two years of part-time studies) provides students with an opportunity to develop their intellectual and theoretical competencies at an advanced level and to strengthen their ability to understand labour law from a viewpoint of critical analysis of the underlying principles.

The LL.M. in Labour Law consists of the following compulsory modules:

Minimum Admission Requirement


In general, as a minimum admission requirement, students must have attained an average of 65% for the law subjects in their LL.B. degree.
