- Support and enable identified academics to achieve higher levels of academic research performance through:
- · Mentoring;
- Providing a suite of research and teaching capacity development activities aimed at scholarship (publications, supervision, collaborative networks, and careeer progression)
- Providing personalised skills development workshops and programmes facilitated by subject experts;
- Providing training and other targeted interventions to enhance the participants' academic leadership skills





Application for funding procedure

Submission of funding **Application** application to Feedback to form the Division submit one application vetted and reviewed provide a application breakdown of processed and the amount forwarded to the applying for **FBPamount** applying for

- Applications need to be submitted well in advance (at least three + months) to avoid any delays; allowing AAMP one month to process an application.
- Applicants who have previously received AAMP funding are expected to indicate, on any subsequent application, the outputs derived from this previous funding.
- All applications must be in full alignment with relevant UJ policies, eg. UJ's Travel Policy; UJ rates for temporary staff etc.
- A short report on the use of approved funding and on outputs achieved must be submitted to the AAMP office within three months.
- All applications to be submitted, by the applicant, to the AAMP office; please cc Portia Wright and Angie Magabane.
