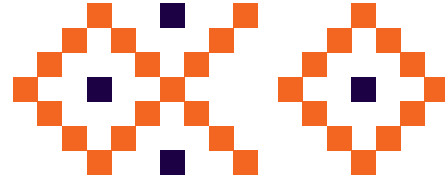

ADMISSION

Admission for all applicants is subject to the faculty qualifications admission point score requirements. Registration of admitted international applicants is subject to compliance requirements as stipulated by the Immigration Act No.13 of 2002, the regulations made thereunder and the university's policy.

APPLICATION AND CLOSING DATE

Applications open on 1 April of the year preceding the year of study and close on 30 September at 12:00 noon. You may apply online at www.uj.ac.za/Apply, or you may download the application form, which should either be submitted to the Student Enrolment Centre or mailed to the University.

Please note: All applicants are advised not to send cash by mail or leave documents and cash with any unauthorised persons. The University charges R200 for hardcopy applications and they should be accompanied by a proof of payment.

All international applicants should take note of the following:

- Submit a completed application form with the following certified supporting documents:
- Sworn English translation of documents (applicants from non-English medium schools only).
- All documents as indicated on the UJ web.
- The University of Johannesburg offers applicants a first and second choice in terms of what they wish to study. All applicants should fill in both a first and a second choice on the application form.
- Submit completed application for on-campus residence with proof of payment for the applicable deposit.

ONLINE APPLICATION PROCESS

Please note the following:

- No application fee will be charged for online applications.
- If you have previously applied and have a UJ student number, please call the UJ Call Centre (011 559 4555) to ensure that your cell number and email address are captured on our student database. This will ensure you receive a PIN number to complete the online application process. An applicant must go to www.uj.ac.za/ Apply and select 'Apply' to complete your application.
- Please keep an eye out on the UJ webpage for any possible change to the instructions to apply online.

Please note: Upon acceptance (admitted or conditionally admitted) you may be required to pay a reservation fee. You will be advised when to pay and this fee will be deducted from your 2023 registration fee.

ENGLISH PROFICIENCY TEST

If English is not an official language or used as a medium of learning and teaching at the school you attended, you are required to provide an English Proficiency Test Score. You may elect to write the University of Johannesburg English Language Programme test (UJELP). Alternatively, UJ will accept the IELTS at an overall score of 6 and TOEFL at an average score of 80 -104 for Undergraduate Programmes.

UNDERGRADUATE DEGREE APPLICANTS

In order to study for a South African degree, applicants are required to have achieved the equivalent of a South African National Senior Certificate with a degree endorsement. All international applicants with high school results or qualifications achieved outside of the Republic of South Africa require a certificate of exemption from the Matriculation Board of South Africa for admission into undergraduate studies. All degree-seeking applicants are required to submit the following supporting documents which must be certified for submission to the Matriculation Board (USAF):

- Completed Form M30 - this form can be downloaded on the Matriculation Board website, www.mb.usaf.ac.za with proof of exemption fee payment
- Certified copies of the applicant's educational results or qualifications certified by a South African High Commission, Consulate, Trade Mission or a Public Notary in your home country
- A certified copy of your passport or birth certificate certified by a South African High Commission, Consulate, Trade Mission or a Public Notary in your home country
- Exemption fee as determined by the Matriculation Board - see website, www.mb.usaf.ac.za
- Sworn English Translation of documents (applicants from non-English medium schools only)

BURSARIES

MERIT BURSARIES

(For SADC students only).

Academic merit bursaries are awarded annually on the grounds of exceptional academic achievement. This is determined according to marks obtained in the six best subjects on your High School Leaving results. Your final High School Leaving results will determine your first year bursary. Bursaries for second and third year studies will be awarded according to the average obtained in the June and December University examinations.

Please note: Bursary values are based on a specific curriculum's tuition fees. The APS will only be calculated on the best six High School Leaving subjects obtained. Life Orientation is NOT calculated in the APS.

ORANGE CARPET

The Orange Carpet is a UJ initiative to further recognise top achievers. The objective of the campaign is to allow top-performing learners early conditional admission to the University as well as special benefits. To qualify for these benefits, a learner must obtain at least an Admission Point Score (APS) of 37 and above with a Level 6 or higher in all subjects in their final High School Leaving results.

STUDY VISA

HOW TO APPLY FOR A VISA

All International applicants who will be applying outside South Africa can submit

their applications at the South African Visa issuing authority (Embassy, High Commission, Consulate and Trade Mission) in their country of residence.

If there is no South African representative in your country, you are advised to apply at the nearest South African Embassy, High Commission, Consulate or Trade Mission.

All international applicants currently in possession of any South African visa are advised to apply for a new Study visa in the name of the University of Johannesburg, 60 days before the expiry of their current visa.

When applying through VFS, kindly select Corporate Account.

The following documents are to be submitted with the study visa application at the visa issuing authority to obtain your study permit:

1. A passport valid for not less than 90 days of the expiry of your visa.
2. Applicable administration fee as determined by VFS or the visa issuing authority.
3. Confirmation and proof of payment of a South African medical aid cover with a medical scheme registered with the SA Medical Schemes Council. Cover must remain valid for the duration of the calendar year.
4. Letter of Offer from the University stating the duration of degree, confirming that the student is not taking the place of a local student and undertaking to inform the Department of Home Affairs when the student deregisters.
5. A medical and radiological report (less than six months old).
6. Yellow Fever vaccination certificate, if applicable.
7. Relevant certificates if married, widowed, divorced or separated.
8. Details regarding arranged accommodation while in South Africa.
9. Proof of sufficient funds to cover tuition fees and maintenance.
10. A police clearance certificate for the past 12 months from the country you have lived in for a period exceeding 12 months after the age of 18.
11. A registration deposit or a return ticket to the country of origin.
12. Applicants are advised to keep a copy of their submission documents and all receipts safely.

ENDORSEMENT FOR PART-TIME STUDIES FOR HOLDERS OF GENERAL, CRITICAL SKILLS, INTRA-COMPANY TRANSFER WORK VISAS AND BUSINESS VISAS

Please be informed that with effect from the 1st of May 2015 a holder of a valid temporary residence visa issued for the categories mentioned below will be allowed to register and undertake part-time studies with Institutions of Higher Learning as defined by the Immigration Regulations of the Immigration Act, 2002 (Act No. 13 of 2002) during the validity period of their respective visas.

- a) General work visa;
- b) Critical skills work visa;
- c) Intra-company transfer work visa; and
- d) Business visa;

The holders of the above-listed categories of temporary residence visas will no longer be required to submit requests to the Department for 'endorsement' of study as a secondary activity. This provision allows for part-time study ONLY. Institutions of Higher Learning registered with the Department of Higher Education are advised not to allow these categories of applicants to study full time on these visas.

The duration of the course/qualification must not exceed the period of validity of the primary visa. A register of such learners must be kept by the institution of learning and be made available to the Inspectorate of the Department of Home Affairs for inspection when required. This Directive replaces the secondary activity endorsements for study as previously provided for in Directive 31 of 2008.

CHANGING CONDITIONS OF A STUDY VISA

A change of conditions of a study visa refers to a situation where one holds a valid permit to be in the Republic other than to study at the University of Johannesburg. This is usually the case of learners and students studying at South African high schools, colleges and other academic institutions and their visas would therefore be endorsed with a condition to study at institutions in any of the categories above. In order to register at the University of Johannesburg the visa will need to be issued in the name of the University.

Application for change of conditions of a study visa constitutes a new application for a study visa. Though the applicant will need to complete a separate form, the requirements are the same as for the initial application of a study visa. MEDICAL AID

All international students need to comply with visa regulations as determined by the Immigration Act, Act 19 of 2004.

Regulation 10 (1) (i) determines the following:
An applicant for a study visa is required to provide proof of medical aid cover with a medical scheme registered in terms of the Medical Schemes Act, Act 131 of 1998, recognized in the Republic. Although you may, with some other international insurance or medical product, secure a study visa from a South African visa issuing authority, the University of Johannesburg, in accordance with the Immigration Act, does not recognise such medical cover for registration purposes.

The University requires proof of full medical aid cover with a South African based medical aid scheme from the first day of the month in which a student seeks registration to the 31st of December of that year. Study abroad and exchange students must secure medical cover for the duration of their stay.

A minimum of six (6) months cover is provided by medical aid companies.

Month-to-month medical aid cover will only be acceptable from dependents on submission of the confirmation letter from the main member's medical aid service provider undertaking to make monthly contributions and to provide proof of these contributions to the University on a monthly basis.

It is thus advisable that international students make the necessary financial arrangements for medical aid cover prior to entry into South Africa. Should the student rely on a sponsorship, he/she should ensure that the sponsor is advised of the requirement at the onset of the sponsorship of the admission offer from the institution. Most institutions do not accept a letter from the sponsor in lieu of payment. Payment for the required medical aid cover fee is made directly to the medical aid company, separately from the tuition fee. The following are medical aid companies with developed student-focused products that are registered in terms of the Medical Schemes Act. They offer the minimum benefits that a student may need while in South Africa. These schemes have weekly consultation sessions on all campuses throughout the year.

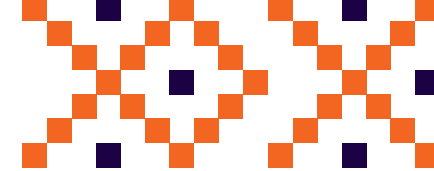
