

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS UJ STAFF 10 February 2022

Will the university be providing students with data?

No, the University will no longer be providing students with data as they are expected to be on campus for classes and can use the facilities the university provides for the backup activities.

What are the COVID-19 cleaning and other arrangements for teaching venues?

All lecture venues will be cleaned daily, microphones are specifically cleaned at the start of the day. Seats and desks are sanitised daily. At the entrance of each venue there will be a foot-controlled sanitiser. Any lecture venue with a Covid-19 case will be decontaminated on the same day depending on the time of the request. The seats in lecture venues will be marked to ensure physical distancing.

Will the Library spaces be cleaned?

Library arrangements are the same as for classrooms, and each library will have a cleaner/s until the library closes. Every second seat must be kept open.

When is it necessary to decontaminate an area?

When staff in an area have tested positive for Covid-19, AND the area cannot be kept out of service for 7 days. Information related to the staff members affected needs to be reported to Occupational Safety, Occupational Health, and for decontamination purposes to Dr Manyaka.

Must I wear a mask when I am teaching?

Yes, all academic and teaching support staff must keep masks on at all times during lectures, practicals or tutorials.

Are wrap-around, rigid plastic face masks acceptable for personal use?

No, they are not recommended as they do not provide adequate protection for those around you.

Is social distancing still in force in social environments?

Yes, the recommendation from the national regulations of 2m distancing remains in force.

What about non-compliance with mask usage?

Please report the misuse or refusal to use a mask directly to Protection Services or Occupational Health. The refusal to use a mask properly must also be reported to the relevant HoD.

If I am infected with Covid-19 at the workplace, is it covered by the Compensation Fund?

Yes, it is covered by the Compensation Fund IF it can be proven conclusively that an employee contracted Covid-19 while at work.

Who conducts Covid-19 Risk Assessments?

Occupational Safety in accordance with the Health and Safety representative of the specific environment.

Who must I report Covid-19 related risks to?

Protection Services. Occupational Safety if it is about the lack of signage, social distancing, empty or vandalized sanitizer stands or work-related diseases.

Must I isolate if I am in contact with an infected person?

Please ensure you report this to Primary Health Care and they will arrange the necessary isolation provision if required, and advise accordingly.

Must I quarantine if tested positive?

Please report this to Primary Health Care and they will arrange the necessary quarantine provision if required, and advise accordingly.

Are UJ events permissible?

Yes, after approval by an ELG member the maximum is 50% of the capacity of the venue. All other requests to host events and activations need to be directed to CCC & CCC Exco for approval before planning can commence. If catered, all meals are to be pre-packed. No social gatherings are permitted after an event unless approved by an ELG member. A request to host an event at UJ must be submitted 4 weeks ahead of time.

If we are vaccinated, why the masks?

Everyone in South Africa is required to **follow** the **guidelines** set by the <u>Department of</u> Health:

- Maintain a healthy physical distance from people (for example, in queues, or in classes / labs)
- Wash your hands thoroughly and regularly
- Use sanitiser when you cannot wash, and
- Wear a mask everywhere on campus and in all UJ facilities that are shared spaces.

Does UJ offer support to staff?

UJ values the mental health of staff and students and has put various support structures into place to assist. Life EHS is the external service provider that offers a wide range of counselling services for staff at no cost. Staff may contact them on 0800 004 770 to arrange counselling.

How do I access support for students in need?

Psychosocial support
