


Graduation Programme

The study investigated universities' annual report disclosure as a

vehicle for public accountability. Content analysis and the Delphi technique informed the development and application of a Public

Accountability Disclosure Index, an Annual Report Quality Index

and a Public Accountability Model.

The study concluded that annual reports are not fit for purpose

in ensuring public accountability and neither reflect nor integrate qualitative characteristics. The self-assessment tools

are expected to assist the regulator in improving accountability

and transparency.

Ehounou Serge Angaman holds a Bachelor of IT Management, a BCom Honours and a MCom (Financial Economics) (both with distinction from UJ). He is an Assistant Lecturer at the UJ School

of Economics, CBE.

His study employed econometric tools and machine learning methods to investigate systemic risk in the South African insurance sector and its potential effects on the South African

economy.

The thesis' novelty is threefold. It shows that some insurers are systemically important. Secondly, the composite stress index of systemic risk for the South African insurance sector is a good predictor of future economic downturns in South Africa. Lastly, quantile regression-based machine learning models perform better in predicting the South African GDP growth lower tail risk than the quantile regression model.

study.

Her thesis contributes to the development of a skills hub in the exchange of knowledge between partners. Visualising the skills in demand versus the skills in supply could entice knowledge

partners to collaborate in addressing the skills mismatch.

Tebogo Emma Bokaba obtained an undergraduate degree in Engineering in Computer Systems at the Vaal University of Technology, a BSc Honours in Information Technology at North-West University and a MCom in Information Technology Management (with distinction) at the University of Johannesburg. She is a lecturer at UJ.

Her research focussed on developing a data-driven framework using Artificial Intelligence methods to addressing real-world road traffic incidents.

Her thesis provides a comprehensive analysis and a forecasting model grounded on Bayesian networks and Bayesian Regression with Markov Chain Monte Carlo techniques. Case study findings indicate that the framework can reveal hidden patterns in incident data, and has the potential to assist the authorities, researchers, and other relevant stakeholders in mitigating future road traffic incidents and saving lives.

Kokou Essiomle holds a Bachelor's degree in Mathematics, a Master's of Actuarial Science and Financial Mathematics and has received a traineeship at Generali Deutschland where he worked as an assistant actuary in portfolio management. He has co-supervised master's dissertations and lectures in financial mathematics, portfolio optimisation and introduction to machine learning at the School of Economics, CBE at UJ.

His thesis extends risk theory concepts to the modelling of financial cash flows and examined the impact of the default arrival process on the insolvency of financial institutions. Conclusions are that in the generalised delayed renewal process, insurers should pay attention to claim management since the time to ruin is highly dependent upon the time taken to report the first claim and the size of that claim.

Lindie specialised in auditing practice and teaches at the postgraduate level (CTA programme) at UNISA.

Corporate failures have led to reputational damage for many companies. This study sought to contribute towards fairness, accountability and transparency in the South African mining sector, through corporate reputation reporting as part of integrated reporting. Obtained results indicate the need to report on corporate reputation to obtain legitimacy.

Her thesis contributes a multi-dimensional reputation reporting by employing exploratory sequential framework methods. The proposed framework is envisaged to translate research into practice and set the scene for further corporate reputation reporting contextualised stakeholder theoretic perspective.

The objective of Lucas' research was to develop a generic conceptual framework for Scaled Agile success which contributes to the body of knowledge with regards to Scaled Agile.

The study contributes the specific measurement of Scaled Agile success.

Zivai Most Machaka is a marketing expert holding a Bachelor of Business Administration, a Postgraduate Diploma, and a MCom (UKZN). Her research interests include consumer behaviour and

Binge drinking is a problematic behaviour that is most prevalent among the youth. The thesis examined the antecedents of quitting binge drinking among the youth in Gauteng, from a social marketing perspective. Positivism guided the research methodology and findings based on structural equation

modelling.

The study reveals that social norms, and self-confidence predict behaviour change. The study contributes new knowledge through an integrated social marketing model highlighting focus areas for future campaigns and policy making.

Ntokozo investigated corporate governance and unethical

South Africa's behaviour within financial institutions. Phenomenology was used as a method of inquiry and a

qualitative research design was adopted.

The results reveal the significant barriers to enforcing ethical

effective corporate governance in the industry as managerial interference in the work of assurance providers,

complexities of the ethics concept, and, at times, an over-

reliance on auditors. To address this gap, a governance and

ethics framework was proposed.

Reon Matwale Matemane holds a Master's degree in Financial Management, a Postgraduate Diploma in Accounting, and a BCom in Accounting Sciences and is a chartered accountant CA(SA). He is a Senior Lecturer at the University of Pretoria. He has a vast experience in academia and practice which include University of Limpopo, University of Johannesburg, ABSA Bank Limited, Standard Bank of South Africa Limited and the Office of Auditor-General South Africa.

Motivated by the executive's pay processes that are reliant on short-term financial performance metrics, the study sought to develop a comprehensive performance metric which incorporated the non-financial measures grounded on ESG philosophy. Data was sourced from a diverse panel of experts, which culminated in the development of a non-financial performance metric.

The study contributes a non-financial performance metric that can be combined with the existing, traditional monetary execution measures to guarantee that the executives are not obsessed with transient additions to the detriment of long-haul maintainability of companies.

Her study aimed to develop an optimal water tariff structure to

incentivise the efficient consumption of affordable water whilst allowing the recovery of costs by the water utility. Secondary

data on water consumption, prices, household sizes and income

were collected.

Her thesis contributes an optimisation model to determine a

simplified water tariff structure while still complying with

legislation to meet the stated objectives.

The thesis centred on how information management can improve performance in local government using tools and technologies within the two main domain areas of financial

management and administrative compliance.

Using the Auditor General South Africa as a source of information, the study concludes that local government could improve performance by applying maturity models capable of presenting their respective levels of maturity in an evolutionary manner consistent to community service delivery needs.

Essodina Takouda holds a Master's degree in Actuarial Sciences and a Bachelor's degree in Mathematics. As a Master's student, he was selected for an exchange programme in the Department

of Statistics at LMU in Munich.

Essodina examined ruin metrics in his thesis to determine the vulnerability of Insurance Companies. To investigate the ruin probability with a delay in the arrival of the first claim, he used the insurance surplus model perturbed by a diffusion process. The second-order delayed with perturbation and a perturbed Erlang renewal risk process with dependence are considered in order to investigate the well-known unified risk measure, namely the Gerber-Shiu expected discounted penalty function.

Motlokwe Thobejane holds a Master of Philosophy in Informatics from the University of Pretoria, an Honours in Information Systems from UNISA and a BSc in Computer Science from the University of Limpopo. He is an ICT Infrastructure Manager at NERSA where he is responsible for the overall ICT infrastructure and operations.

Organisations implement cloud computing (CC) to realise the benefits that CC brings. However, cloud computing brings additional complexities and risks to IT projects.

His thesis presents a cloud computing project management framework to effectively implement cloud computing projects. Fifty-one factors were identified through a qualitative exploratory approach. Cloud computing project complexity, change management, project management knowledge areas and an agile approach are the significant factors for successful cloud computing projects.
