Lynn Smith has been a lecturer in the Department of Sport and Movement Studies at the University of Johannesburg for the past 10 years. She obtained her Master's degree in Biokinetics from the University of Johannesburg in 2014, where she also completed her Honours (Biokinetics) and undergraduate Bachelor of Science (Life and Environmental Science with Sport Science endorsement) degree. She is a qualified Biokineticist, registered with the Health Professions Council of South Africa. She has published six articles in accredited journals. One of these was published from her doctoral research.

This thesis aimed to develop a toolkit, consisting of two questionnaires, to adequately assess the health-related quality of life of patients living with selected non-communicable diseases within a South African context. During focus groups and semistructured interviews with healthcare practitioners and patients, it became clear that the concept of health-related quality of life is poorly understood and under assessed in medical practice. It also became apparent that there were many disparities between healthcare services offered at the private and public sector levels. The major contribution of this research in both a South African and international context is that it will provide healthcare practitioners with cost-effective, valid and reliable tools that can be administered easily to patients from various socioeconomic backgrounds. It will also emphasise the need for a more holistic and comprehensive approach to diagnosing, evaluating and treating illnesses, such as diabetes mellitus, hypertension, and other cardiovascular disease.

Mthombeni, Solomon Karabo (PhD)

Solomon Karabo Mthombeni completed his Master's degree in Biokinetics in 2017 and, most recently, his Doctor of Health Sciences in Sport Science. His doctoral research was aimed at exploring support among South African Olympians from disadvantaged areas. The study discovered poor financial and sponsorship support at development level, poorly maintained sport facilities, dysfunctional school sport systems in townships and rural areas, lack of scientific, medical, logistical support, and mentorship, as among the significant barriers towards achieving sporting success. The study developed a conceptual framework for athlete support and career pathing. This has important implications in the transformation and inclusivity of South African sport. Solomon has published his findings in the International Sport Studies Journal and presented his work at the International Festival of Sport and Exercise Medicine Conference in 2022. Solomon continues to conceptualise a new funding model for South African sport to allow for effective transformation in the sector.

The candidate's research was aimed at exploring support systems among South African Olympians from historically disadvantaged areas. The findings identified inherent barriers towards sporting excellence and transformation, but also developed a conceptual framework for athlete support and career pathing for this population group. The findings have been published in international journals and presented at the International Festival of Sport and Exercise Medicine conference. The candidate continues to conceptualise a new funding model for South African sport.
