# Chabaya, Blessing (PhD)

Blessing Chabaya holds an Honours degree in Industrial Psychology from Rhodes University and a Master's degree in Human Resources and Labour Relations from Nelson Mandela University. She lectures in the Faculty of Economic and Management Sciences at the University of Pretoria.

She explored harmonising employment conditions in South African higher education. Using a sequential multi-method qualitative design with thematic analysis, her findings reveal that labour legislation and ILO principles were significant to harmonisation; challenges arose from internal and external institutional factors; and improved employee morale and the promotion of a decent work agenda accrued to insourced employees. Her proposed Management Framework for Harmonising Conditions of Employment after Insourcing guides management towards harmonious workforce employment.

# Munsamy, Mervin (PhD)

Mervin Munsamy is currently the Country Human Resources Manager of ABB and is responsible for overseeing the HR Function for Southern Africa and serving the Regional Labour Relations Centre of Expertise. Mervin holds an MCom in Human Resource Management from the University of Johannesburg and an MBA in Management from Milpark Business School.

His study developed and validated a digital leadership competency framework applying a sequential mixed-methods research design. Data was collected using interviews with management (N=11) and a newly developed questionnaire (N=241) from an automobile company.

Combined, the analyses confirmed six leadership competencies: embracing digital technologies, facilitating the digital drive, leadership digital skills, establishing a digital culture, leadership digital adaptiveness and resilience, and digital competitive intelligences. The study presents a validated digital leadership competency framework to promote 4IR leadership practice.
