


The training that will be offered

This BA Hons Art Therapy (AT) (first offered in 2020) introduces the professional qualification of Art Therapy as a pre-requisite to enter the Masters programme in Art Therapy which will create further career opportunities for selected visual arts and allied professional graduates to produce relevant, capable and ethical professional practitioners who are able to meet the psychosocial demands of South Africa's traumatised and fragmented society.

NOTE: The student obtaining this Honours aualification cannot practice clinical Art Therapy before obtaining a Masters qualification, which is a registered profession with the Health Professions Council of South Africa (HPCSA).

The BA Hons (AT) is a qualification for BA Honours Visual Art and Design, Education and Humanities graduates who wish to specialise in the foundations of the theory and practice of Art Therapy, where the focus is on the research, individual and group art practice and community engagement and arts based social action.

Approved by the HPCSA, articulation can occur for crossdisciplinary supervision and interdisciplinary arts therapy research and practice through community work placements and supervision. Further possibilities for articulation related to this programme include Wits University's Drama for Life (DFL) and Drama Therapy Honours and Master's programmes; University of Pretoria Music Master's programmes; UK and USA Art Therapy Programmes. The UJ Departments of Psychology, Social Work and Educational Psychology have expressed interest in interdisciplinary collaboration where appropriate, and the requirement of registering for Psychology credits will be available at UJ.

in the BA Hons (AT) qualification will draw on historical and more contemporary approaches to Art Therapy, both internationally and locally. The theoretical frame will be based within psychoanalytic and psychodynamic ways of thinking as well as within community based social action approaches. The training will consolidate and integrate community-based experiences with the body of knowledge and theory gained from developing and developed countries that offer an accredited Art Therapy training. The BA Hons (AT) will provide training that is in line with minimum standards of practice and at the same time. respond specifically to the unique South African context. Selection is based on academic merit, the candidate's art portfolio, psychological maturity, and capacity to engage creatively with their internal world and external worlds. Candidates require a minimum of two years of Psychology. Applications are approved by the Departmental

Committee comprising a panel of assessors from the Visual Art Departmental Committee and Art Psychotherapy specialist lecturers.
