Project description

The 28th of October 2022, the **10th anniversary** of the **International Day of the Girl Child (IDG)** was commemorated. Over the last decade governments, policymakers, and the general public has welcomed the voice of the girl child, a voice that was for often never heard or ignored. Despite this investment envelop, Yet, girls continue to confront a myriad of challenges to fulfilling their potential, which was made worse by the crises of climate change, COVID-19 and humanitarian conflict globally.
