CONTEXT

The effective management of risks is of paramount importance for the long-term viability and prosperity of both Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) and various industries. To foster knowledge sharing and collaboration, we propose organising an International Conference on Risk Management in HEIs. The primary objective of this conference is to facilitate the convergence of experts from diverse HEIs, with the aim of deliberating on the most recent advancements and optimal approaches in the field of risk management. The purpose of this conference is to provide a forum for professionals to share their risk management experiences, insights, and research findings in HEIs, facilitate discussions on emergent risk management trends, challenges, and opportunities, promote networking and collaboration among risk management professionals, academics, researchers, and industry experts, promote the exchange of ideas, strategies, and best practices to improve HEIs' and industries' risk management practices, and encourage the creation of novel approaches and solutions for addressing risk management challenges.

This conference will serve as a forum for discourse, education, and planning regarding the pivotal matters centered on the primary technologies propelling the Fourth Industrial Revolution (4IR). It will examine how these technologies are revolutionising various industries, altering our lifestyles and work environments, and transforming the higher education sector at an unprecedented rate in human history. The five technological advancements under consideration are artificial intelligence (AI), robotics, Internet of Things (IOT), 3D printing, and blockchain. However, the challenges encountered by Africans and the rest of the world, such as a power crisis, ageing infrastructure, economic issues, and war in Eastern European countries, impede the incorporation of the most advanced technologies in various sectors. In addition, the Conference aims to provide attendees with an understanding of the National and Global landscape, its effects on the higher education sector, and its impact on our current standard of living. It will also provide a forum for the exchange of knowledge; to discuss best practices for identifying, assessing, and managing risks across a variety of organisations, as well as insights into the most recent developments and trends in risk management. This chapter will also explore the impact of emerging risks. such as: Power Crisis, Ageing infrastructure, Climate change among other things.

Given the complex nature of these various factors, the conference endeavors to exhibit pioneering methodologies for managing risk, such as the implementation of technology and data analytics. Additionally, UJ, a prominent advocate for the Fourth Industrial Revolution (4IR) in Africa, will present a novel approach to pedagogy and learning.
