Basson, Gert Johannes (PhD)

Gert Johannes Basson holds a BTh, BTh Hons, MTh, and DTh degrees from the University of South Africa, and a DEd degree from the University of Johannesburg. His career primarily focuses on the development of leaders, from previously disadvantaged communities, in South Africa and other African countries.

Across the world, the globalised, fast-paced information era creates new challenges for executive leadership teams that are working in multinational corporations. It is critical that global businesses address the challenges of how culturally diverse executive leadership teams can work together more effectively as a team.

His thesis investigated how cultural diversity impacts the dynamics and effectiveness of executive leadership teams. A proposed theoretical Diverse Executive Team Impact (DETI) model was developed and empirically validated.

The study demonstrated the important factors related to cultural diversity, and the positive impact thereof on team dynamics and effectiveness. Strategies derived from the DETI model can assist organisations in building the capacity of their culturally diverse executive leadership teams to enhance their team dynamics and effectiveness.

Tracy has over 15 years' experience lecturing and working in the field of tourism and event management.

Her thesis developed a recovery framework for sport event tourism in South Africa following the impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic. Grounded in the sport tourism framework and the resilience and stakeholder theories, the study adopted a sequential mixed method research design. The key findings of the study reveal that following the pandemic, a new sport event tourist typology has emerged, seeking holistic and immersive experiences that make use of technology. Key to the recovery of sport event tourism in South Africa and its future sustainability, is the development of a more resilient subsector, guided by policy developed collaboratively by multiple stakeholders and viewed through the lens of resilience. Theoretically, the study contributes to the existing body of knowledge through the development of a novel recovery framework for sport event tourism in South Africa.

Mabitsela, Tshegofatso (PhD)

Tshegofatso Mabitsela is a lecturer at the University of Johannesburg's Department of Industrial Psychology and People Management. She holds a Master's degree in Industrial Psychology from the University of Johannesburg and is registered with the Health Professions Council of South Africa.

Her thesis aimed to determine the perceived fairness of B BBEE in the workplace, develop and validate an instrument that could assist in measuring such perceptions, and investigate how these perceptions influence organisational outcomes.

The study reveals that employees prefer that their superiors communicate clear performance standards and expected outcomes. Also, when employees perceived B BBEE as fair, they were likely to give more of themselves through greater levels of psychological availability and accentuate their job performance. While organisations have limited control over the distributive justice aspect of B BBEE, they can influence the processes involved in its practice.

Nkomo, Nomusa Yolanda (PhD)

Nomusa Yolanda Nkomo has a BCom in Economics and Econometrics, a BCom Honours in Economics, and an MCom in Economics from the University of Johannesburg and is currently a lecturer at the University of Zululand.

Her thesis examined the determinants and socioeconomic impacts of tobacco smoking in South Africa. The empirical analysis from various econometric techniques reveals that mental health behaviours have a significant impact on an individual's decision to smoke as part of self-medication strategy; smokers' children are more likely to be at risk of being overweight or obese; both maternal and peer smoking negatively impacts fertility; and low-income smokers' households invest less in their children's education.

The key conclusion is that maternal tobacco consumption has dire effects on women and children's health and displaces household resources for food and education. The study presents a stimulus for the South African government to rethink their strategies to curb tobacco smoking.

Pearson, Hayley Kirsten (PhD)

Hayley Kirsten Pearson holds a Bachelor of Science from Rhodes University, a Postgraduate Certificate in Education (cum laude) from UNISA, and a Master of Business Administration (cum laude) from the University of Pretoria's Gordon Institute of Business Science, where she is a senior lecturer and the Executive Director of Academic Education.

Her thesis explored individual constructions of accountability from a multi-level perspective within an organisational context. Through a qualitative research approach and a constructivist grounded theory design, a substantive theory of accountability was abstracted. The findings show that individuals construct accountability through the dimensions of personal, others, and organisational, comprising three accountable employee, components; living as an building accountability relationships, and creating a culture of accountability. The theory culminates in achieving an accountable state of being and is underpinned by the accountability dependencies; mutualism, symbiotic relationship between trust and accountability; and oscillations of accountability and expectations models. The theory advocates for organisations to adopt learning from accountability and taking a systems view to accountability.

The study's insights contribute towards deciphering the complexity of this ambiguous construct. The theory application offers organisations a deep understanding of how individuals experience and enact accountability, thereby improving the effectiveness of its deployment to drive performance.
