Professor Heather Morris-Eyton is an associate professor in the department of Sport and Movement studies at the University of Johannesburg. She holds a doctorate in Sport Science where the focus of her research was sport coach education. Her research interests include women in sport, safeguarding, antidoping as well as sports coaching. She is passionate about sport and the safeguarding space and is an advocate for the protection of athletes particularly in her role as a national coach and high-performance manager for Lifesaving South Africa. She was the national coach for the lifesaving team that represented South Africa at the recent Commonwealth Lifesaving Championships in Canada. She sits on the SASCOC coaches' commission and is a member of the International Lifesaving Federation sports education committee. She is also an education officer for the South African Institute for drug free sport where she conducts numerous anti-doping workshops for athletes and support personnel.
