



## TENDER T UJ 33/2024: ATLAS TI SOFTWARE LICENSE RENEWALS

### 1. PURPOSE OF THE REQUEST

The purpose of the submission is to request approval for the appointment of a supplier to continue providing licenses and support for the Atlas Ti academic software for the UJ Academic staff and students for a period of 3 years.

### 2. BACKGROUND

ATLAS.ti is a software package used for analysis of qualitative data. It can also be used as a tool to support the literature review. It is one of the most widely used software applications for this purpose. It is used by highly ranked tertiary education institutions, both internationally (e.g. University of California, Berkeley and Harvard Business School) and locally (e.g. University of Stellenbosch and UJ).

It is a strategic advantage for the University to have a site license for ATLAS.ti. ATLAS.ti is used by a significant number of UJ academics and postgraduate students to achieve UJs research objectives. It is used for analysis of qualitative data for research projects, and it is used to teach about qualitative analysis in training and teaching programmes. Demand for the licenses is high. UJ currently has 100 concurrent licenses for staff and 100 concurrent licences for postgraduate students.

ATLAS.ti is widely used for a number of reasons. Five key reasons include: it is relatively easy to use; the program is highly regarded in the qualitative research community for having relevant techniques and tools to achieve strong qualitative analysis; it is affordable; it is relatively easy to find training on how to use IBM SPSS; there is good support systems for the software. Having a site license prevents the need for hundreds of individual staff and postgraduate students having to purchase individual licenses (a single transaction instead of 10s of transactions).
