

HOW TO APPLY

Applications for the course open on 01 April 2025. Applications will be accepted until 31 October 2025 @ 12h00. International students are encouraged to apply early to ensure sufficient time for visa processing.

There are TWO steps in the application process:

Step 1: Apply here AND

Step 2: Send the following documents to the CSDA at csdainfo@uj.ac.za:

- Proof of your online application
- Academic transcripts and degree certificates
- Copy of ID or passport
- CV
- Letter of motivation outlining why you would like to do the course
- 1-2 page essay on the social policy or social development challenge you would like to focus on in your research
- 1-2 contactable academic or work-related references.
