This conference seeks to bring together scholars, diplomats, policymakers, and civil society leaders to explore how Africa can reimagine and assert its sovereignty, rethink its strategic partnerships, and shape global governance with confidence and agency.

- Critically examine diplomatic and foreign policy challenges facing African states in 2025.
- Assess Africa's agency and influence in global governance, especially in the G20.
- Explore conflict prevention, regional integration, and collective security strategies.
- Advance African-centred narratives in diplomacy and international relations.
- Strengthen collaboration between academia, foreign ministries, and policy institutions.
